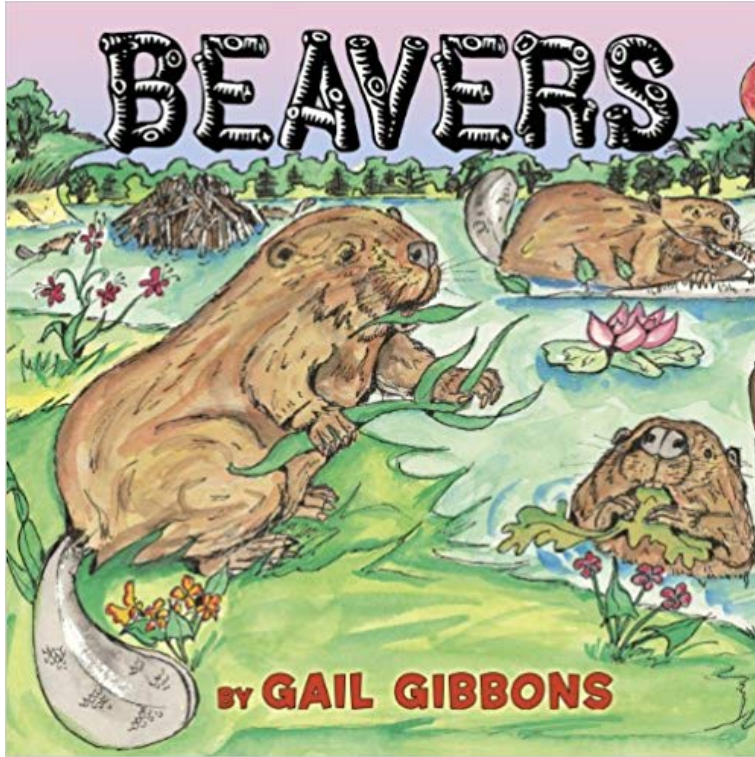


# Beavers
